Member Survey


Thank you to all members who responded to our survey - we had 26 responses.

The following chart (repeated in a larger size at the end of the newsletter) outlines the frequency of your responses against the items we listed. Clearly training days (including with verbal feedback), competitions and clinics are most favoured by our members. Working Equitation and combing dressage and show jumping competitions also featured strongly.



We also asked you to tell us what you saw as being important in relation to the competitions we hold. From the table below you will see that 25 (96%) of members who responded believe that having a friendly atmosphere at events and the condition of the riding surface were their two most important attributes. These were closely followed by the cost of entries and frequency of competitions (92% and 80% respectively).

Reflections from Brisbane CDI Dressage competition – Andy Forbes





I was at the Brisbane CDI for my FEI Para classification and took the opportunity to scope the opposition for the Southern Districts riders.

Typical Qld, 23c sunshine and no wind but a very low key event, considering it was an Olympic qualifier. The consensus was the Hendra vaccines. A lot of horses are having adverse reactions to the vaccine. Whilst these are no longer compulsory if your horse has an injury etc requiring a vet no vaccine no vet. They won't run the personal risk.

I was mainly interested in the Medium to Advanced classes. Whilst there were

some quality horses on show the competition was somewhat flat, by saying that the riding was very conservative, correct but not asking for the wow factor.

There were a few 59% with 69% winning and 68% and 67% following up but the main stream were around the low 60%. It really did bring home the fact that our horse and rider combos here in WA would have been highly competitive and a couple of riders from SDDC, on past competitions, would have been podium finishes.

I videoed a couple of hours of tests and got to watch a couple of our Olympic riders in the Grand Prix, the suppleness, calmness and harmony of these top combination campaigners is truly inspiring and worth riding with in the back of one's mind.

So to wrap it up WA certainly is on par to the eastern states. If you get a chance to see any of these qualifiers in the future don't forget your video camera. It's always good to compare where you are at with you training.

No Frills Dressage Competition 2019

Wow, what a fabulous day! We wanted to offer you a relaxed, no fuss, friendly and fun competition and we did just that - even the weather was glorious! The day offered 2 tests at each level up to Medium which proved popular with riders who wanted to consolidate their

partnership before the WA State Dressage Championships later this month and the Albany Show.

Over 50 tests were ridden on the day, 14 of which scored over 65% with Karina Taylor taking the day's honours with a 71.57% in the Novice 2C - well done!

Congratulations to all for presenting their horses, especially to those of you who are new to our sport and/or were on green horses.

Having listened to your survey feedback we offered a free lunch platter to encourage the friendly atmosphere - how did you think that went?


