Entry Information

A maximum of three (3) tests per day and only two consecutive levels may be ridden per horse/pony throughout the competition.

All horses will be required to wear a number. **Restricted SDDC class riders will be nominated a number.** Riders must provide their own number holder and it must always be displayed whilst the horse is being ridden. The number can either be displayed on the bridle or saddle blanket **and must be on both sides.**

Helper Duties

Riders may self-help for one horse only. If the allocated helper duty is not completed at the event then the rider will be eliminated.

Catering. There will be no canteen at the event

\$32.00 per test + DDF levies (\$8 for 1 test or \$14 total for 2 or more tests/day)

A completed entry acknowledges understanding and acceptance of all Conditions of Entry.

This event will be conducted in accordance with the current EA Dressage Rules (as amended).

Classes

Competitor Classes

- i. Rider must be a Competitor member of EA;
- ii. Horses & Ponies must be EA registered and hold a current Dressage Performance Card;
- iii. Ponies must hold a current, valid EA height certificate.

Restricted SDDC/AEC Member Only Classes.

Riders must be members of SDDC/AEC

Registration & Performance Cards. All membership & registration documents, and current valid Dressage Card must be available on request.

Dress Formal riding attire is required for all classes.

Plaiting of horses Horses are to be plaited for all classes.

Horse numbers All horses will be required to wear a number. Restricted and SDDC/AEC class riders will be nominated a number. Riders must provide their own number holder and it must always be displayed whilst the horse is being ridden. The number can either be displayed on the bridle or saddle blanket. There must be a number on both sides of the horse.

Emergency Contact Person. When completing your entry, please enter the name and phone number of the Emergency Contact Person who will be with you at the event

Code of Conduct Please ensure you are familiar with the Equestrian WA Code of Conduct, available at www.wa.equestrian.org.au.

Warm up Etiquette. (See map for areas reference) Correct protocol in the warm up area is expected. Lunging is only to be undertaken in the grassed area 6 located next to the club rooms. The round yard is not to be used during the competition.

Protests and Appeals These must be in writing and accompanied by a fee of \$50. Refer to 'SDDC Protest Protocol' at www.sddc.org.au/site/competitions

Yards and Camping There are yards and camping available at the AEC however no powered sites. If yards are used, they must be cleaned of manure and hay, and the gates closed before leaving the AEC. To book camping go to the AEC website www.albanyequestrian.net

Refunds and Scratchings Entry fees will not be refunded after the closing date of entries unless a medical or veterinary certificate is produced within 5 days of the completion of the event (18 April 2025).

Change of Riders & Horses Riders may be changed before the start of the class however a rider of a horse may not be changed if another rider has ridden the horse on the day either in warm-up or in the competition event. Horses cannot be changed, and the draw position cannot be changed without the permission of the Organising Committee.

Presentations. Presentations will take place at the completion of the event at the club rooms. Competitors are asked to attend presentations in full competition dress.

Restricted riders. There are two age categories for restricted riders: Up to and including 18yrs, (until the end of the calendar year in which the rider turns 18) and, 19yrs and older (from 01 January in the year the rider turns 19yrs).

Ribbons and prizes:

Restricted classes: Ribbons will be awarded to place getters in each age category for each test i.e. Novice 2.1 (18 Years). Prizes will be awarded to overall place getters as noted below, for each test. e.g. Novice 2.1.

Competitor classes: Ribbons awarded place getters for each class category for each test, Open and Pony. Prizes will be awarded to overall place getters as noted below.

Class sizes - Prizes;

Classes of two or less competitors, prizes will be awarded to 1st place.

Classes of 3 competitors, prizes will be awarded up to 2nd place.

Classes of 4 - 10 competitors, prizes will be awarded up to 3rd place.

Classes of 11 – 14 competitors, prizes will be awarded to 4th place.

Classes of 15 or more, prizes will be awarded to 5th place.

Dogs Must always be on a leash. If complaints are made regarding an unruly dog the Organising Committee may require the dog to be removed from the event.

Officials, ground staff and volunteers These people are essential to the running of the event. Please treat them with respect. Poor sportsmanship will not be tolerated. Verbal or physical bullying behaviours will be reported to the Organising Committee and disciplinary action will be taken where appropriate.

Duty of Care It is your responsibility to promptly report unsafe and or hazardous situations to the Organising Committee.
